The unnamed narrator of Ben Lerner's new novel has travelled to Providence, where he is to conduct what will be the final published interview with Thomas, his ninety-year-old mentor and a giant in the arts. But the narrator drops his smartphone in the hotel sink. He arrives at Thomas's house with no recording device, a fact he is mysteriously unable to confess.

What follows is one of the most remarkable exchanges in recent literature. Thomas swings between extreme lucidity and mental disorder, at times conflating the narrator—who he believes is recording the conversation—with his son, Max, and ultimately straining the narrator's own sense of the border between reality and fiction.

Transcription tells the story of the vivid triangle that the narrator forms with Max and Thomas, producing unexpected entanglements between his student and his son. Both Max, whose mother committed suicide when he was a child, and the narrator, who has losses of his own, are trying to raise young girls in a burning world. And both will have trouble accepting Thomas's decision to end his own life—a year after it was nearly lost to Covid.

Swift and intricately wrought, full of hidden symmetries, *Transcription* is a brilliant meditation on those technologies that enrich or impoverish our connection to each other, that preserve or obliterate memory.

Haunted by Kafka (there are echoes of "The Judgement" and "The Hunger Artist"), but utterly contemporary, Lerner combines trenchant insight with lyric mystery. Ultimately *Transcription* demonstrates what only a work of fiction can record.

About the Author - Ben Lerner is the author of seven previous books of poetry and prose, as well as several collaborations with visual artists. The recipient of fellowships from the Fulbright, Guggenheim, and MacArthur Foundations, Lerner has been a finalist for the National Book Award for Poetry and the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction, among many other honors. He is a Distinguished Professor of English at Brooklyn College.

Years after escaping her unbearable artworld friends in New York for a new life in London, an unnamed writer finds herself back on the Lower East Side attending a dinner party hosted by Eugene and Nicole – an artist-curator couple – and attended by their pretentious circle. It's the evening after the funeral of their mutual friend, a failed actress, and if the narrator once loved and admired Eugene and Nicole and their important friends, she now despises them all. Most of all, however, she despises herself for being lured back to this cavernous apartment, to this hollow, bourgeois social set, for a dinner party that isn't even being thrown in their deceased friend's honour, but in the honour of an up-and-coming actress who is by now several hours late.

As the guests sip at their drinks and await the actress's arrival, they are unaware that the narrator, from her vantage point in the corner seat of a white sofa, is silently and mercilessly eviscerating them and everything they stand for. And when the guest of honour finally does arrive, she sets in motion a catastrophic end to the evening, laying bare the hypocritical decadence of the hosts' vacuous little lives.

Vicious, hilarious, propulsive, and at times unexpectedly tender, *Happiness and Love* is scintillating in its magnificent cruelty and its monstrous, absurd humanity too.

Without Cassandra, Aaron would probably be dead. Fortunately, she won't leave him—despite the infidelity, crippling depression, and disparate but increasingly frequent spells of drug and booze-addled debauchery. But after the latest of his catastrophic lost weekends, she might be reaching the end of her rope. Cass and Aaron, like the other neurotic, ambivalent intellectuals in their orbit, are at the crossroads of their thirties, no longer young enough to excuse their reckless behavior but not yet ready to settle down.

Among their circle is Malcolm, who, like Aaron, grapples with self-destructive habits and a marginally successful writing career; his partner, Violet, a doctor whose urgent professional crisis dwarfs her peers' self-inflicted disasters; and Antonia, a romantically wayward teaching fellow whose book about ecocide may just get her a tenure track job at a prestigious university. When Sam, a charming trust fund punk at the center of this loose network suddenly dies, and a global pandemic subsequently takes hold, all five must contend with the lives they've made—their desires and disappointments, habits and hang-ups, pathologies and addictions, and the possibilities of making art and being good as the earth whirls to its end.

Down Time marks the triumphant return of Andrew Martin, author of the pitch-perfect slacker classics Early Work and Cool for America. Compulsively readable and contagiously intelligent, this is a wryly comic social novel of doubling down, selling out, growing up, and getting out that turns a darkly funny and hyper-literate eye on our most desperately guarded ambitions: to love and be loved, to know and be known, and, if at all possible, stay sane in devastating times.

An upper-middle class couple in Bangalore, Venkat and Viji, find their quiet life upended—and the flaws in their marriage exposed—when two strange young men come knocking at their door in the middle of the night, claiming to have business with their daughter, Rekha, a college senior who happens to be visiting relatives in the countryside. Venkat—a narrator whose account of his marriage, and of the lives of his wife and daughter, we soon learn to doubt-sends the boys away, but they come back the next day, and now they're not alone.

While Venkat begins to fear for his daughter's safety, he is haunted by the memory of a betrayal and disappearance from long ago. As his guilt-ridden imagination leaps between knowing and unknowing, evasion and confrontation, Shanbhag reveals not just the tensions in a marriage or a family. but also the polarization of Indian politics and the resurgence of the Hindu right.


Derry is already abuzz with news that famous American actor, Monica Logue, has flown to the city and will be starring in a new series set during the Troubles. And then she goes missing...

Ava thought the great tragedy of her life would be getting stuck in a dead-end office job, especially after she dropped \$250K she didn't have on a master's degree in Classical Vocal Performance a decade ago. But reality looks even grimmer than student loan repayments and watery office coffee when she goes on an ill-fated hike in the Adirondacks with two of her coworkers.

Decomposition Book is part queer love story, part survival tale with an exhilarating and irreverent Gen-Z voice that blurs the line between the supernatural and the psychological with intoxicating verve.

A World Appears is the story of the quest to solve the greatest mystery in nature: consciousness. How does it feel to be you with your own personal feelings, thoughts and experiences? Every one of us is intimately familiar with consciousness, but no one knows how—or why—it came to be that three pounds of spongy gray matter can generate a subjective point of view. (If indeed that is how it happens; it may not be.)

The early 1990s marked the birth of a new science of consciousness, based on the assumption that the phenomenon could be explained in terms of brain activity using the tools of reductive science, but that effort is faltering, and wilder ideas, such as panpsychism, are now getting a hearing. Indeed, there is now reason to doubt that "objective science" as we have known it since Galileo has the right tools to plumb first-person experience. A story that begins in a brain lab in Seattle ends, of all places, in a cave in the mountains of New Mexico, where the author discovers that explaining consciousness may be less urgent than learning to practice it in our everyday lives.

What kind of freedom is possible if we accept the whole story and embrace who we really are?

With hope, heart, and relentless honesty, she points a way forward for all of us, revealing the power of radical truth-telling to deepen our connections—with others and ourselves.

In the vein of Small Fry or Priestdaddy, No Ordinary Bird is a compelling father-daughter story that reads like true crime, haunted by a question the dashing and mysterious Lamar Henderson had always taught his daughter to ask: "How do you tell the good guys from the bad?"

Artis was five when a plane crash killed her beloved father. For years, it was simply called "the accident."


But many things weren't getting discussed. Like Lamar himself—a swashbuckling, larger-than-life pilot, a doting father and husband, and the most popular farmer in Georgia. Or that the IRS had immediately taken everything: the chickens, the airplanes, the islands in the Bahamas. . . . Afterwards, Artis and her mother broke contact with everyone and fled, rebuilding from the bottom up as if Lamar's big, wild life had never happened.

Years later, a friend tells Artis Lamar's plane was sabotaged: her father had been one of the biggest drug smugglers in Miami in the 1970s. At the time of his death, he was about to testify in a corruption trial that had swept up everyone from the Prime Minister of the Bahamas, to a US district attorney, to the Columbian drug cartels. But the deeper Artis digs, the more unexpected the story becomes.

Beyond the dramatic betrayals, glamorous drug lords, and geopolitical intrigue is the beating heart of this riveting memoir: a daughter's grappling with a dark legacy and her memories of the father who had been the light of her life. Who are the good guys, who are the bad guys, and is there a difference at all?

About the Author - Artis Henderson's work has appeared in *The* New York Times, The Daily Beast, Reader's Digest and Sierra, among others. Her first memoir, Unremarried Widow (Simon & Schuster, 2014), was a New York Times Editors' Choice and featured in over 10 Best of the Year lists. Her second book is forthcoming from HarperCollins (2025). 
